2018 LEGISLATIVE SESSION REPORT CARD Bill Summaries

- + HB 2017: state land department; continuation**
(Passed – Chapter 62)
Continues the State Land Department for five years.
- + HB 2047: workers' compensation; employee definition; LLCs**
(Passed – Chapter 175)
Allows members of an LLC to be covered for workers' compensation.
- + HB 2107: pharmacies; practices; pharmacy benefits manager**
(Passed – Chapter 133)
Allows a pharmacy or pharmacist to disclose an alternative prescription drug.
- + HB 2153: campaign finance; nonprofits; disclosure**
(Passed – Chapter 134)
Protects non-profits from disclosing membership on campaign finance forms.
- + HB 2162/SB 1147: county transportation excise tax**
(Failed)
Allows a county to submit a transportation plan funded by an excise tax to the voters for approval.
- + HB 2167: Arizona Commerce Authority; continuation; requirements**
(Passed – Chapter 66)
Continues the Arizona Commerce Authority for an additional six years.
- + HB 2311: limited liability; employers; ex-offenders**
(Passed – Chapter 137)
Protects an employer from liability associated with hiring a person previously convicted of a criminal offense.
- + HB 2479/SB 1392: TPT; digital goods and services**
(Failed)
Creates parameters for determining the taxable status of digital goods and services at the state and local levels.
- + HB 2526: career technical education districts**
(Passed – Chapter 311)
Renames JTEDs to Career and Technical Education Districts.
- + HB 2602: running nodes; blockchain; regulation prohibition**
(Passed – Chapter 208)
Prohibits local governments from impeding a person running a blockchain node in a residence.
- + HB 2603: corporations; blockchain technology**
(Passed – Chapter 122)
Expressly allows businesses to utilize blockchain technology.
- + HCR 2028: wages; leave; retaliation presumption; repeal**
(Failed)
Repeals the presumption of employer retaliation taken against employees for asserting wage rights.

- + SB 1100: workers' compensation; claim settlement**
(Passed – Chapter 212)
Allows for full and final settlement of workers' compensation claims.
- + SB 1205: unemployment insurance; educational employers; interest**
(Passed – Chapter 25)
Makes multiple pro-business changes to unemployment insurance statutes.
- + SB 1247: health insurance; mandated provision prohibited**
(Passed – Chapter 165)
Prohibits local governments from requiring an employer to provide health insurance to its employees.
- + SB 1273: GRRC; review; licensing requirements**
(Passed – Chapter 337)
Allows the Governor's Regulatory Review Council to consider license requirements.
- + SB 1444: schools; American civics education**
(Passed – Chapter 289)
Provides for American civics as a requirement in schools.
- + SB 1500: employment security; employee; employer; status**
(Passed – Chapter 171)
Excludes from state unemployment taxes any individual not considered an employee under federal guidelines.
- + SCR 1005: initiatives requiring expenditures; ten-year repeal**
(Failed)
Repeals initiatives 10 years after its effective date if the initiative proposed mandatory expenditures of state revenues.
